Policy 2:180 High School Student Ambassadors

The Board of Education wishes to learn about student opinions, issues, and concerns and wishes to provide students with educational experiences with the operation of the school district. The process for selection, responsibilities, and participation of Student Ambassadors are found in Administrative Procedures. The Board President will determine the appropriate number of ambassadors and designate two representatives from the Board of Education to select students to fill any vacancies.

The student members will not have voting privileges and may not attend closed sessions of the Board of Education.

Administrative Procedure 2:180 High School Student Ambassadors

There shall be at least four Student Ambassadors to the D200 Board of Education. The ambassadors will be appointed for up to a two-year term. Two new ambassadors will be named annually.

The Principals of Wheaton North and Wheaton Warrenville South will solicit nominations from the faculty and community for the position of the student ambassador annually in the fall. Nominated students will be invited to complete an application and/or interview for the position. The Board President will designate two representatives to interview candidates and present their recommendation to the full Board. Each high school Principal will also designate a representative from their administrative team to join the interview process.

Once selected, student ambassadors will attend an orientation session provided by the Superintendent of Schools, High School Principals, and

The responsibilities of the ambassadors are

- Attend regular Board of Education meetings on a scheduled established at the beginning of the year
- Serve on the Principal's Advisory Committee
- Present reports to the Board, in person or in writing, as requested
- Facilitate student focus groups and review student feedback as directed by the Principal,
 Superintendent or Designee
