Which instructional materials will be piloted in classrooms this year?

Background Information

- In 2010, the new Illinois Learning Standards were adopted by ISBE.
- Until recently, few high-quality instructional materials were available that are aligned to these standards.
- CUSD 200 elementary teachers and administrators expressed the need for ELA instructional materials.

Importance of High-Quality Instructional Materials

High-quality instructional materials supports learning acceleration in many ways:

- 1) Creates a strong coherence within a grade level and between grade levels
- 2) Allows specialists to better support students in co-teaching models
- 3) Frees teachers to spend their time differentiating and scaffolding learning rather than gathering and creating instructional materials on their own
- 4) Increases equitable access to grade-level learning
- 5) Provides strong assessment tools
- 6) Provides resources for interventions that are aligned to classroom instruction

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Selection Process

January - February 2022	Principals and coaches studied the ELA shifts that would be used to guide the selection process.
March - May 2022	The selection committee reviewed high-quality instructional materials aligned to the shifts and provided feedback.
June - August 2022	Administrators continued to review additional instructional materials. 32 staff members participated in a book study or ELA shifts training.
September 2022	The selection committee reviewed the three instructional materials. Two were selected to pilot be the selection committee.

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Materials

Bookworms and ARC Core are the two instructional materials being piloted.

Both are highly aligned to the instructional shifts for English Language Arts of:

- Foundational Skills
- Text Complexity
- Evidence-Based Reading and Writing
- Knowledge Building

Pilot Team

Teachers

Kindergarten: 1 teacher

First grade: 7 teachers

Second grade: 5 teachers

Third grade: 6 teachers

Fourth grade: 3 teachers

Fifth grade: 4 teachers

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Next Steps

- The pilot will run from mid October mid February.
- A recommendation will come to the Board of Education in March.
- Professional learning on the shifts will be provide to all K-5 ELA teachers.
- An implementation plan will be created with staff after the pilot is completed.
